From the Nurse's Office:

Students need to stay home if they are ill, and should not return to school until they are symptom-free of fever, vomiting, or diarrhea, for 24 hours. When students are sent home from school through the nurse's office with illness, automatically, the next day is too soon to return to school. Currently, through the nurse's office, the number of fevers seems to be down, but a new stomach virus is emerging, which does not always include fever, but rules still apply to the symptoms of diarrhea and vomiting.

Cafeteria Reminder

Please remember to check your child's lunch balance. The cost for: Breakfast is \$1.00 daily (full pay) – .30 cents (reduced). Lunch is \$1.75 (full pay) – .40 cents (reduced). Milk only is \$.45 . Please be sure your account balance is paid in full.

Please remember to dress your child according to the weather. If the temperature is less than 32° including the wind chill, the children won't go out for recess but they might go out with their teacher for a short time, to get some fresh air. Appropriate clothing includes, gloves/mittens, coats, closed shoes, hats. It's a good idea to dress your child in layers.
