From the Nurse's Office:

Students with illness and/or fever of 100 degrees or higher must be picked up from school within 1 hour of parent being contacted. Children must be fever/illness free, without the help of Advil or Tylenol, for 24 hours before returning to school. Vomiting, diarrhea, with no fever are also "staying home" requirements. If your doctor tells you it is a virus that has to run its course, and medicine won't cure it, the child needs to be at home until 24 hours after last symptoms. Even if the child says they want to come to school, they must stay home until risk of infecting classmates and staff is minimized.
